AWARDS CRITERIA

- 1. The nominee is evaluated by his exceptional leadership and excellence in the course of his contribution to humanity in general. In essence, proof of nominee's outstanding leadership and excellence in his field of endeavor as well as his unparalleled contributions to society constitute the basis for the TOYM Awards.
- Nominee must have complied with all the rules governing nomination such as age, citizenship, etc. contained at the back of the page of the official nomination form.
- 3. Nominee must engaged in his/her field of endeavor for a substantial part of his/her life with documented proof subject to verification by the TOYM Search Committee.
- 4. Nominee must engaged in contributing to the cause of humanity for a substantial part of his/her life with documented proof subject to verification by the TOYM Search Committee.
- 5. Filipino citizens (including naturalized citizens between the ages of 18 to 40) are eligible for nomination. Nominees for 2009 must not have reached the age of 41 by December 31, 2009. Nominees must not be former TOYM awardees.

By Filipino nominees must either

- a. Those wherever born, in the Philippines or in a foreign country, of Filipino parents. In this case, the father or the mother may
 be a natural born or a naturalized of the Philippines or;
- b. Those, as the time his or her bid was received by the TOYM Committee, is a naturalized citizen of the Philippines and those who have elected Philippine citizenship; or,
- c. Those, despite having renounced his citizenship at the time his or her bid was received by the TOYM Committee has one or both parents who is/are citizen(s) of the Philippines; or,
- d. Those, despite living outside the Philippines as resident aliens or immigrants of another country, has one or both parent who is/are citizen(s) of the Philippines.
- 6. These annual awards are given to recognize the young men and women who have proven themselves worthy of honor and emulation based on the criteria:
 - a. Service to the community and/or to the nation (40 points)
 - b. Professional excellence and integrity in their respective of endeavor (40 points)
 - c. Leadership, including moral rectitude, innovativeness and pioneering spirit (20 points)

RULES GOVERNING SUBMISSION OF NOMINATION

- Nominator for TOYM shall be open to individual of all fields. Any person or organization can nominate one or more individuals subject to the requirements stated below.
- 2. Nominations should be made on the prescribed TOYM nomination form and notarized accordingly. All information therein shall be submitted in English, Tagalog or Taglish.
- Nominee must sign the nomination form attesting to all stated facts therein; giving consent to the independent to the verification by the TOYM 2009 Search Committee and the subsequent publication of said factors; and indicating his willingness to attend the awards ceremonies if selected.
- 4. A certified true copy of the nominee's birth certificate or any equivalent proof of date and place of birth should accompany nomination.
- 5. Five (5) copies of nominee's picture (5' x 7') black and white or colored should accompany the five (5) copies of the accomplished Nomination Form. Also, pictures must be submitted in digital form stored in compact disk (CD).
- 6. A one-page Executive Summary of the Nominee summarizing the important facts and accomplishments as presented in the scrapbook shall accompany the nomination forms.
- 7. The Scrapbook shall be subject to the specifications as indicated in the technical requirements for attachments.
- 8. An original or certified true copy of the nominee's NBI Clearance should also accompany the nomination.
- 9. All entries are to be mailed or personally delivered to the JCI Philippines Bldg., 14 Don A. Roces Avenue, Quezon City on or before August 15, 2009 Mailed entries should be postmarked not later that the same date.
- 10. The TOYM Search Committee of the JCI Philippines shall be the operating body of the project and reserves the right to pass judgment on any issue that may arise in connection with the above rules.
- 11. TOYM Committee will review the entries to ensure that all technical requirements are complied with.
- 12. The Screening Committee composed of past TOYM awardees, shall conduct a preliminary selection of the nominees as finalist for consideration of the Board of Judges.
- 13. The Board of Judges composed of respected individuals shall select the winners. Their decision will be final and unappealable. They may opt to call the finalist for an interview as they deem fit.
- 14. All data, information submitted in connection with the TOYM awards shall be treated with the strictest confidentiality.

THE OUTSTANDING YOUNG MEN

The JCI Philippines: as an organization has the following goal and mission: to contribute to the advancement of the global community by providing young persons with the opportunity to develop leadership skills, social responsibility and fellowship for a positive change. This mission finds basis in the Jaycee Creed, which believes:

That faith in God gives meaning and purpose to human life;
That the brotherhood of man transcends the sovereignty of nations;
That economic justice can best be won by free men through free enterprises;
That government should be of laws rather than of men;
That earth's great treasure lies in human personality; and
That service to humanity is the best work of life.

The JCI Creed, which is universal in its perception and exhortation, sees man not only in the light of what he is but what he can be. This precept proceeds from the principle that earth's great treasure lies in human personality, which must be developed in its wholeness. This recognizes with implicit faith that God gives its dimension.

The Creed likewise exhorts man to hold on the convention that government, which is man's own creation, must conform with the demands of humanity; it should not therefore be of men but of laws – laws that are just, and promote the dignity of man and a better understanding among mankind; The Creed emphasizes also a measure that free man in the pursuit of his enterprise, and must therefore be guaranteed economic justice.

"... That earth's great treasure lies in human personality and that service to humanity is the best work of life." It is in this context and spirit that the TOYM awards was conceived. If it is idealistic, it is because man must have his idealism if he has to shape for himself a better future, a better world.

The Outstanding Young Men (TOYM) Awards is now in its 51° year. The Awards began as a project of the JCI Manila , patterned after the TOYM of America Awards and later adopted by the JCI Philippines as an annual project. It is now a yearly undertaking of the JCI Philippines and co – sponsored by the Gerry Roxas Foundation, Inc. and the TOYM Foundation, Inc.

Over the years, the TOYM has become an institution, having developed a reputation for its selectiveness of outstanding young men upon whom the award is conferred. TOYM seeks to give national recognition to young men and women whose selfless dedication to their profession or vocation has resulted in significant contributions to the welfare of their countrymen and our country at large, as well as to the advancement of their respective fields of endeavor. The awardees who have become light of the nation totaling 415 by now, is literally a Philippine "Who's Who" in outstanding achievements in areas such as community service, the arts, literature, journalism, education law, politics, agriculture, science and technology, economics, banking, business, sports, government service, and other fields of endeavor.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAM

- 1. To recognize the outstanding achievement of our nation's youth which have benefited significantly the community and the nation;
- 2. To focus public attention and confer national recognition to these achievements and contributions.
- 3. To inspire others, especially the youth, with the recognition to these achievements and/or leadership of the TOYM awardees-leaders who have demonstrated vigor and enterprises in tackling the problems of society and offering solutions;
- 4. To live the JCI Creed and consider as a good measure of performance by the awardee.

While other awards give recognition purely to humanitarian work, the TOYM Awards is uniquely given for outstanding leadership and excellence and contributions to humanity.

QUESTIONS ABOUT THE NOMINEE

As part of the scrapbook, the nominator must answer the following questions about the nominee on a separate sheet. Indicate by number where each answer begins. Answers must be printed, double – spaced on standard A4 of letter-size bond paper. Be as brief and factual as possible.

- Describe the career of the nominee. Please include background, scope of nominee's work or activity and his resources in achieving his
 goals.
- 2. Narrate the nominee's exceptional achievement or contributions in his/her chosen field/s, organization, community, nation or the world.
- 3. List quotations, statements of authorities, honors and awards received which evaluate his/her achievements or contributions.
- 4. Did the accomplishments of the nominee result in the advancement of the public? Is it an outstanding contribution to public welfare and the country at large? Does it promote interest in youth and nation building?
- 5. Summarize the nominee's most outstanding humanitarian efforts, how the nominee exemplified the line of JCI Creed that states," that service to humanity is the best work of life."

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTACHMENTS

- The Nomination Form, together with all original attachments (documentary and supportive evidences) as required and necessary for the nominee.
- Accomplishment shall be bound together in the form of a scrapbook for submission.
- Each page of the scrapbook should be numbered. The first page should be used for the nomination form followed by the attachments required under the Rules Governing Submission of Nomination and followed by the Executive Summary and the answers to the Questions about the Nominee.
- The scrapbook shall be limited to 30 pages only, including annexes that serve as reference or supportive evidence to the information provided in the scrapbook, the annexes must be properly labeled for ease of reference.
- Four (4) additional copies of the scrapbook shall likewise be submitted and becomes the property of the Junior Chamber International Philippines. 5.
- The nomination documents, pictures and other submitted attachments must be submitted in digital form stored in compact disks (CD).
- Any individual, public or private entity or organization may nominate a candidate in any of the following fields:
